

Bella, to the brink of insanity with an insinuating kindness that masks more sinister motives. While Mr. Manningham is out, Bella has an unexpected caller, inspector Rough from Scotland Yard. FFP Says Good-bye to Bill Rayle

William 'Bill' Raymond Rayle, 70, of Findlay, Ohio, passed away on Friday, July 26, 2019 at Bridge Hospice Care Center. He is survived by his brothers: Terry (Mary Ellen) Rayle, Daniel (Sharon) Rayle, Thomas Rayle; his sister, Shirley (Larry) Pettengill, and sister-in-law, Bonnie Rayle; as well as several nieces and nephews. In addition to his parents, William was preceded in death by a brother, Donald Rayle, Jr.

Bill was a 1968 graduate of Findlay High School, attended Anderson College, and worked for 40 years at the Findlay YMCA. He was known by all to be a gentle, kind, and loving soul.

Bill's first FFP production was in 1971, when he played Angie the Ox in *Guys and Dolls*, and his most recent role was as part of the ensemble in the 2013 production of *Jekyl & Hyde, the Musical*. In all, Bill was involved in 137 productions at FFP. He was in 15 plays, 10 musicals, worked tech for 66 productions, and did both for 46 productions (25 plays / 21 musicals). Bill did so many things for productions that it is easier to say what he didn't do - his history shows that he was never a director, musical director, or orchestra member. He was a board member for 16 seasons, serving as president for four seasons and vice president for five seasons. Bill received the Gypsy Robe in 1984 (Little Mary Sunshine) and the FFP Annual Recognition Award in 1983 and was named a member emeritus in 2013.
