The four one-acts are Box and Cox by John M. Morton, Driver's Test by Don Zolidis, Check Please by Jonathan Rand, and The Most Massive Woman Wins by Madeleine George.

Box and Cox, directed by m. James Foust

Mrs. Bouncer (Brooke Trenor), a London lodging-house keeper, is renting an apartment to two gentlemen. Mr. Box (Andrew Packard), a printer on a daily newspaper occupies the room during the day, and Mr. Cox (David Marguart), a journeyman hatter occupies the room at night. They invariably meet on the stairs of the lodging-house when one comes in from work as the other is going out, but neither has any idea that Mrs. Bouncer is renting his room to the other.

Auditions Announced for Spring Production

Auditions for the final production of the 2018-2019 season, A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to

the Forum, have been scheduled for March 4 and 5. Inspired by the farces of the ancient Roman playwright Plautus, the musical tells the bawdy story of a slave named Pseudolus and his attempts to win his freedom by helping his young master woo the girl next door. The plot displays many classic elements of farce, including puns, the slamming of doors, cases of mistaken identity (frequently involving characters disguising themselves as one another), and satirical comments on social class. The title derives from a line often used by vaudeville comedians to begin a story: "A funny thing happened on the way to the theater". This Tony Award winning, nonstop laughfest was written by Burt Shevelove and Larry Gelbart, with music and lyrics by Stephen Sondheim.

Director Samantha Henry will be holding auditions at the playhouse (300 W. Sandusky St.) on Monday, March 4, and Tuesday, March 5 at 7:30 p.m. Caroline Guy, the choreographer will be leading some dance movements, so please dress appropriately. J.R. Smith, music director, asks that each auditioner prepares a song to sing for the auditions that is approximately 1 minute in length. Please bring sheet music; an accompanist will be provided. There will also be cold readings from the scripts.

Pseudolus: A Roman slave, owned by Hero, who seeks to win freedom by helping Hero win the heart of Philia.

Hero: Young son of Senex who falls in love with the virgin, Philia.

Philia: A virgin in the house of Marcus Lycus, and Hero's love interest.

Hysterium: The chief slave in the house of Senex.

Senex: A henpecked, sardonic Roman senator living in a less fashionable suburb of Rome.

Domina: The wife of Senex. A manipulative, shrewish woman who is loathed by even her husband.

Marcus Lycus: A purveyor of courtesans, who operates from the house to the left of Senex.

Miles Gloriosus: A captain in the Roman army to whom Marcus Lycus has promised Philia.

Erronius: Senex's elderly neighbor in the house to the right.

He has spent the past twenty years searching for his two children, kidnapped in infancy by pirates.

Gymnasia: A courtesan from the house of Lycus with whom Pseudolus falls in love.

Tintinabula: A jingling, bell-wearing courtesan in the house of Lycus.

Vibrata: A wild, vibrant courtesan in the house of Lycus.

Geminae: Twin courtesans in the house of Lycus. Panacea: A courtesan in the house of Lycus.

Proteans: Choristers who play multiple roles (slaves,

citizens, soldiers, and eunuchs).

Presented through special arrangement with Music Theatre International, *A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum* will run May 2-5, 9-12, and 16-19 at the playhouse.



Delegates Meeting Report

The second OCTA Northwest Region delegates meeting of the 2018-2019 season was held on Saturday, February 16, at The Fort Findlay Playhouse in Findlay. The meeting was attended by nine people representing nine theaters and the OCTA board (four delegates, one regional rep, and four board members).

Harley Antesky, regional rep, led those present through the following discussions:

Finances

The NW account currently has a balance of \$2,790.31.

State Conference Updates from Michelle Johnson & Jesse Bernal

- Workshops are coming together; they are hoping for 12 workshops. If you have a suggestion for a workshop topic or someone whom you've heard and think would be good for OCTA, send the information to Michelle Johnson at msjcatmom@gmail.com.
- The game of Slingo may be brought back.
- Working on ways of communicating the location of events during the conference most social events will be in the Hilton, but some could be in the Home2Suites. For example, the 'Pub Crawl' for St. Patrick's Day: each region will be asked to host a pub and they could be in either hotel. For Halloween, those participating could be in either hotel. All excerpts, workshops and the delegate meeting will be at Owens.
- The number of meals available at the banquet and brunch will be capped at 230, due to the size of the venue.
- The committee is working on an a-la-carte type of pricing, so you only pay for events in which you want to participate.
- The Hilton will be fully booked over the Labor Day Weekend with 2 other events, so don't wait till the last minute to book your room. You can book online two links are posted on the state conference Facebook page: OCTA State Conference. Each link explains the benefit on which hotel to choose.

Redistricting

- A motion was presented to divide the NW Region finances evenly by the number of theaters, with the resulting
 amount being used as the amount to be given to the new North Region for each theater moving from the NW to
 the North. This was presented by Jesse Bernal and seconded by Michelle Johnson. Due to the lack of a quorum of
 theaters, there will be an email vote.
- Besides helping with funding, the NW will help with the North's first regional and with general organization.

These are general seating tickets and those purchased online will be picked up at will call only. With 165 tickets available, there is a possibility of the region making \$2,475.
